

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
### WHAT DOES MEDICAL SUCCESS LOOK LIKE?

## CSH-SIF RANDOMIZED TRIAL OF SUPPORTIVE HOUSING IN SAN FRANCISCO

- Collaboration of TNDC and SF DPH
- Universe: 30,000 SF Health Plan members over the age of 18
- 180 identified who were homeless high users (> \$3000/year)
- Randomized to treatment (offered housing) vs. control
- Subjects homeless status verified by direct interview
- 50 in treatment arm moved in to housing at Kelly Cullen Community
- Health care utilization 1 year prior vs. 1 year after move in

## KELLY CULLEN COMMUNITY

172 unit, renovated former YMCA located in Tenderloin in SF

Includes ground floor primary care clinic, gym and theater

**\$90 million development cost** 

7 on-site case managers, 1 full-time RN, 1 full-time HW


Fully accessible studio apartments (@ 350 square feet each)

Move-out rate (including eviction and deaths) of about 10% in first year


## RESULTS

- Mostly male, average age 50 years old, equal Black and White
- Some increase in cost among control totaling \$117,000 (\$1,850 per subject)
- Major reduction in cost among treatment totaling \$1.3 million (\$26,300 per subject)
- Most of the cost savings in reduction in inpatient days
- Cost of housing plus services is about \$15,000/person/year (does not include development costs)


#### Gender - Treatment and Control Groups




#### Ethnicity - Treatment and Control Groups




#### Age - Treatment and Control Groups





#### **Control Group Healthcare Cost**




#### **Treatment Group Healthcare Cost**
