What is the California Law Revision Commission?

- An independent state agency.
 That assists the Legislature.
 By studying problem areas in the law.
- □ And recommending reforms.

What is the benefit of a Commission study?

The Commission is nonpartisan and objective.

The Commission's process is completely open.

All interests are considered.

What is the goal?

Make the law easier to understand and use.

Fix problems.

Consider whether the state should be involved in regulating CIDs.

Fundamental challenges with CIDs.

CID governance is very complicated.

Mistakes are inevitable.

Checks and balances are weak.

Burden falls on volunteers.

Consequences Can be Serious

Inadequate reserves = large special assessments

□ Financial mismanagement

Lawsuits

Law Reform Not Enough

Improved laws can help.

But law alone can't eliminate the problems.

State Assistance

The Commission recommended that the state collect a modest fee from homeowner associations and use the money to provide assistance.

Direct assistance can help to avoid or resolve many problems inexpensively.
