

Policy Academy to Reduce the Prevalence of Chronic Homelessness

Participating states: **California, Georgia, Washington, and Louisiana**

Participating Federal agencies: **HHS (SAMHSA, CMS, ASPE, and HRSA), HUD, DOJ, DOL, VA, and USICH**

GOAL: Reduce the rate of chronic homelessness in each participating state through a SAMHSA-sponsored, cross-agency Federal effort to provide intensive, targeted technical assistance to state teams.

LEADING CHANGE

Each state has:

- A Faculty Team to support the state by providing tools, resources, and expertise to help the state develop a plan based on the best available knowledge of what works.
- A State Team that includes representatives of key government agencies, persons with lived experience of homelessness, providers, and others with essential expertise and skills.

PA START UP	The Faculty Team provides preliminary research on the state based on public data. The State Team supplements the research with other state sources. State and Faculty Teams analyze state strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats relevant to reducing the prevalence of chronic homelessness.	The Faculty Team visits the State Team for a 1.5-day meeting to assist the state to develop its strategic plan. Most states will develop a "logic model" to guide the plan.	State teams identify TA needs, and the Faculty Team arranges consultations, webinars, and meetings with leading experts.
