

CHRONICALLY HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS: CALIFORNIA AND NATIONAL DATA




POLICY ACADEMY WORK TO DATE

LEARNING FROM EACH OTHER




HEARTH ACT

- Nobody is homeless longer than 30 days.
- Performance Measures
 - Reduce the number of people who experience homelessness
 - Reduce length of time people remain homeless
 - Reduce returns to homelessness
 - Reach all segments thoroughly
 - Increase income stability to sustain housing



LOCAL SOLUTIONS



STRATEGIC OPPORTUNITIES

Goal 1

Expand use of mainstream resources for persons still experiencing chronic homelessness or in permanent housing, taking full advantage of ACA and Medi-Cal reform.



STRATEGIC OPPORTUNITIES

Goal 2

Increase access to permanent supportive housing (PSH) in existing inventory and programs by persons who are chronically homeless.

Design the California PSH approach
